OFFICIATING REPORT - BC BOWLS SAGM - MARCH 21ST, 2015

On the 1st April, the Crystal Mark Laws of the game will be played throughout Canada. The rule changes have been sent by me to every district secretary to distribute to every club within the Province. Hopefully this has been done.

In August 2014 World Bowls officially approved the most recent version of the Laws of the Sport and they are required to implement the new laws by April 1, 2015.

The following is a summary of the most important changes:

A brief Overview of the changes are as follows:

In the Forward Section the word "Should" was replaced by "Must". No confusion now hopefully.

The Laws in the book have been placed in a much easier readable order and they have been re-numbered, and a lot easier to find any particular law.

Basic Changes:

Trial Bowls:

There is now a penalty - if a player uses more than the permitted number of bowls during trial ends – That player loses the right to play any remaining bowls in the trial ends.

Groundsheets:

It will not be necessary to fasten groundsheets to the green.

The Mat:

A player may turn over the mat during adverse weather conditions.

& Foot Faults

Before delivery a player must be standing on the mat with all or part of at least one foot on the mat. At the moment they deliver the jack or a bowl, the player must have all or part of one foot on or above the mat

Dead Ends:

When bowls need to be transferred to the opposite end to replay a dead end, this should occur in a way that avoids distracting players on adjacent rinks. In other words, carry or Rake the bowls back to the correct end.

Deciding the number of shots:

There is now a penalty for measuring before the end is - the defaulting team cannot play any more bowls – and measuring is defined.

A drawn game in a knockout (eliminating) competition:

The extra end must be played from where the previous end was completed. However, if that if that extra end has not been started from the correct end and each team has played a bowl, play in that end will continue.

Game Stoppages:

If a substitute is required in a game that is restarting after a stoppage, that substitute cannot be a member of another team. In other words any player who has played in the competition, that player can not be a substitute for another team.

Bowl displacement by a disabled players equipment or assistant:

The provisions regarding displacement of a bowl or jack by a disabled player's wheelchair now include all of their equipment or their assistant

In a side game:

In a side game, regulations can be adopted for dealing with an absent player (Condition of Play)

Duties of players and officials

Score Card:

The skip's duties regarding the score card may be transferable, but only if BCB adopts a new Domestic Regulation – A Decision will be made by Bowls Canada at the end of March

Player Disability: A player with a physical disability is allowed to kneel on the green, and may kneel in front of the mat or on the mat.

&

A player with a physical disability can use an electronic communication device, if permitted in the Conditions of Play.

Markers:

A marker does not need to tell the players the running score if a scoreboard is being used.

Manager:

The role of 'manager' is no longer recognized in the laws – only the coach can give advice to a player.

A Coach giving Advice in an improper manner.

If, in the umpire's opinion, this law has been broken, the umpire must ask the coach or delegated deputy concerned to stay within the law. If they do not stay within the law, the umpire must ask the Controlling Body to take immediate action to make sure that the offender stops breaking the law.

The umpire has more authority to enforce this law - the same as for dealing with spectators

Field of play and equipment:

A liner siter - similar to a mirror - is now a recognized item of equipment

Administration:

Time limits are now formally accepted for domestic events

Game Points:

Three game points (not 2) are awarded for games won

Jack Re-Spot

Where provisions are made for re-spotting of the jack, tournament organizers may choose either 3 re-spot locations or one re-spot location

Players:

When players' visits to the head are restricted in the conditions of play, it is permissible for a player who is standing in the head to stay there until it is time to deliver their own first bowl

Slow Play:

There are suggested regulations for dealing with slow play, The Conditions of Play me include putting the offending team 'on the stopwatch'. Once the offending team has been put on the stopwatch, they will be required to deliver all their bowls in each of the remaining ends within a four-minute period (timed by an official specifically allocated for that purpose).

Crystal Mark 3 Rule Book

The book is now available and can be ordered now by Clubs or players. The cost per copy is \$8.00 plus postage. An order for 50 or more copies will be \$7.50 plus postage.

The Pilot Course for Umpires has been accepted by Bowls Canada and as the Provincial Officiating Chair for Bowls BC; Part of my duties now are to offer training and assessment for the Umpires within the Province, which I look forward too.

At the present time I am half way into a course for six members from the North Island wishing to become umpires. The course is being held at Parksville LBC, which I thank them I do thank the club for.

There is a form on the BC Bowls Web Site for assessing umpires who have officiated for you and I really would like the conveners of competitions to complete the form and let me or your district POC have a copy to assist with our Umpire Training Program.

Last year a number of clinics for Rules, Measuring and Markers were held within the province and were well attended. The same clinics are again on offer this year together with the Level 1 Umpire Course to all clubs and their members.

All the Provincial Tournaments were covered by our umpires and the feedback I had was very good. I would like, on behalf of all the officials to thank all the clubs for their hospitality and help. It was very much appreciated.

I would like to give a special thanks to our president Harry Carruthers who was last year's Director of Games. Harry put a great deal of time and effort into the arranging of venues and it was very much appreciated. My best wishes to Steve Santana who has taken over Harry's role and with the knowledge and expertise he has in the game I am sure he will do an excellent job for us all.

I would finally like to thank the Board of BC Bowls who a group of unpaid volunteers who work extremely hard for our enjoyment. We all know they can please some of the people some of the time but not all of the people all of the time.

BOWLS BC COACHING COACHING REPORT SAGM 2015

We have two club coach courses planned. One to be held in Ladner on Mar. 29th and one in Parkville on Mar 31st. Both courses depend on the availability of Manuals. At the moment the club coach Manuals are being revised. The revisions should be finished By the end of March. If so the courses will go ahead with the new manuals, if not we will have to make do with what we have left of the old ones. I have only six set for the Ladner course. Ron Leslie, Ron Davies, and Jeff Dixon are organizing the island course. Ron Leslie says he still has some old manuals. If he has enough the course can go ahead as scheduled, if not it will have to wait for the revisions to be completed. Several Months back Alan Stirling in Kelowna expressed an interest in becoming a Learning Facilitator(LF) and be able to train coaches in the interior. I have found a LF core training course being put on in Kelowna in April 2015. I asked Alan to signup for the course and Bowls BC would cover the fee of \$50.00. After he completes that part of the course I will go to the interior and co-Facilitate a club coach course with him, and that will complete his training. We will then have a LF in the interior.

George Cubiss and myself had a conference call with Eric Sinker from Via Sport, We spent approx an hour discussing how our sport is dealing with training coaches and officials and how Via Sport can help with the training. As a result of this phone session we were informed about an upcoming Coaching admin conference on Mar 11/12 in Richmond. I attended this conference and gained a lot of information about how Via Sport, CAC (Coaching association of Canada) and the NCCP can help with the training, evaluation and Certification of Coaches and Learning Facilitators (LFs). The question I am most often asked is about coaches who were trained under the old NCCP system. Do their qualifications transfer over to the new system. I emailed Bowls Canada about this and got this reply from Katie Gardiner. "It my understanding that Bowls has been transferred into the new context. Any coach who has **certifications** in the Old NCCP Program will automatically be transferred into the new context. The old certifications will still show on their online transcript, but so will the new equivalent". To further update the previous statement this has not happened as yet. It will be done when bowls Canada completes the coaching development program, which should be done by the end of March. It may take until September for all the approvals to take place.

I have received an email from Katie Gardiner at Bowls Canada with the following information:

A new Coaching level(Performance Coach) has been developed and should be approved by Mar 31st 2015.

Performance Coach (NCCP Competition - Development) is for:

- Coaches of athletes who are of intermediate and advanced skill levels and who want to compete successfully at the national level
- Coaches of athletes in Provincial and National tournament competitions.
- © Coaches of athletes wishing to compete internationally.

Looking forward to the new season.

- -fees haven't been put up for years, still \$13.50 per member
- -having a meeting in Ottawa this week to discuss revenue generating measures, they've done a lot of pruning, need to look at new ideas
- -lan is always available to come to the Clubs
- -we are behind the ilawnbowl program
